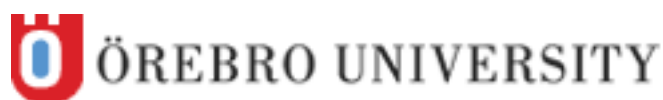

Examination Methods

Role play Seminar, 2 Credits. (Code: 0100)

Active participation in and discussion of role plays during the seminar.

Presentation Seminar, 1 Credits. (Code: 0200)

Presentation of individual written assignment and active participation throughout the seminar.

Individual Written Assignment, 4.5 Credits. (Code: 0300)

Write an individual assignment.

Grades

According to the Higher Education Ordinance, Chapter 6, Section 18, a grade is to be awarded on the completion of a course, unless otherwise prescribed by the university. The university may prescribe which grading system shall apply. The grade is to be determined by a teacher specifically appointed by the university (an examiner).

According to regulations on grading systems for first- and second-cycle education (vice-chancellor's decision 2010-10-19, reg. no. CF 12-540/2010), one of the following grades is to be used: fail, pass, or pass with distinction. The vice-chancellor or a person appointed by the vice-chancellor may decide on exceptions from this provision for a specific course, if there are special reasons.

Grades used on course are Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Grades used are Fail (U) or Pass (G).

Presentation Seminar

Grades used are Fail (U) or Pass (G).

Individual Written Assignment

Grades used are Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).
